



INSCAPE STUDENTS WIN NATIONAL PLASCON PRISM AWARDS COMPETITION!




Two of the three category winners of the prestigious architecture and design competition, the Plascon Prism Awards, were from Inscape

Liezani Kotze won in the residential category with her design called The Mobile Lab and the overall winner was Chacey Eder, 21, a final-year Interior Design student, with her design, Baobab Raincatcher.

Chacey's design was of an African icon, the Baobab tree, made from recycled plastic and painted in colours from the Plascon 2009 Colour Forecast. The tree is a filtration system, creating a renewable water source that can be used at lodges, beach-fronts, informal settlements, playgrounds, parks and on nature trails.

The brief challenged students to create a space inspired by nature's cycle of renewal and regeneration. Chacey has won a five-day trip to London to attend the 100% Design Exhibition, the UK's leading architecture and design exhibition.

The competition started at universities, universities of technology and design schools in February and 130 entries were received. Entries were judged on innovation, aesthetics, colour use and overall insight and application of the concept in each category.
